The Prayer and Pledge were dispensed with.

President Lepine, Director Crystal Taylor and Director Todd Eppley were present representing the Administration.

There being no Proclamations under Agenda Item 3, Council Member Cognevich moved to Agenda Item 4, “Status Report by the Parish President”. Without objection, so ordered. President Lepine reported on the following topics:

- **COVID:** There have been 4,300 cases since the beginning of the pandemic; the positivity rate is 5.4% compared to last month’s 32.8%. Test kits are available at all libraries and the PALH Courthouse starting today;
- **HURRICANE IDA:** The State advised Plaquemines Parish that it will receive \$2.3M in Hazard Mitigation funds. Twenty-three travel trailers have been leased through GOHSEP and fourteen through FEMA. FEMA will not be placing trailers in “V” zones; however, they will work to house those other households approved for DH in “AF” zones;
- The airshow is coming back to Belle Chasse on March 19th and 20th;
- The Governor announced that \$2.6 billion will be made available in CORPS funding for Louisiana Projects. This funding will support coastal, water management and hurricane risk reduction projects throughout south Louisiana; and
- There will be a Mardi Gras parade held on Sunday which starts at the Bethlehem Baptist Church and ends at the Davant Community Center beginning at 9:00 a.m.

Council Members raised the following topics:

- Council Member Cognevich asked for Mosquito Control to spray the parks for Baseball games;
- Council Member Blink asked for more specific information about Coastal Projects reported on in the President’s update. John Helmers stated that CPRA did not release any information on specific projects. Council Member Blink then asked if the Administration was working on the flyover or hump over Naomi and President Lepine said they are aggressively working to get that done;
- Council Member Barthelemy thanked the Administration for cleaning up the park and said it now looks like it used to. He asked if anything was being done in regard to the influx water in Braithwaite at the railroad. President Lepine said there have been conversations with Stolthaven to put a gate there for the Railroad and then raise the road. He further stated that as of now there is no money secured for this with the RPC. President Lepine also said they are actively trying to get this road raised, as well as the road from White Ditch to Phoenix;
- Council Member LaFrance asked if John Helmers knows when CORPS will name a contractor for the LaReusitte to Myrtle Grove project and he was told that PPG did participate in the pre-construction and they are working on the project now. However, he does not know the name of the contractor. Council Member LaFrance asked if there was a time frame for the completion of the project and President Lepine said it should be done in three years. Council Member LaFrance then inquired about the Suzie Bayou project and was told that the assessment team is waiting on cross surveys to move forward with the work. There is no reported time frame on 100% completion; and
- Council Member Newberry said she has received a number of complaints about not seeing areas being sprayed for mosquitos. She asked if they can spray in order for the residents to see that the \$7.00 fee is being put to good use. She also asked if the Administration could provide updates on when spraying will take place. Crystal Taylor said they will begin spraying in March.

Council Member Cognevich moved to Agenda Item 4b, “Update by Charter Directors”. Without objection, so ordered. The following topics were discussed:

- Council Member LaFrance asked for an update on the Port Sulphur Library and was told by Todd Eppley that he did a walk-thru with Ms. Walker. She had a list of 4-5 items which needed to be taken care of and most of those items were taken care of quickly;
- Council Member Barthelemy asked for the Grader to be brought to the marina;
- Council Member Newberry stated that she has received a number of duplicate light pole requests. Todd Eppley informed the Council Member that he sent several requests to Entergy for repair and two weeks ago an outside contractor came to do some work, but they are slow in responding;
- Council Member Rousselle asked for an update on the Archer Study. Crystal Taylor said that a conference call was held yesterday and all the questionnaires were uploaded to Archer;
- Council Member Blink asked John Helmers to reinstate regular CZM Committee meetings. He also said he was interested in holding a joint meeting with St. Bernard Parish. Mr. Helmers said he would plan for a meeting during the second or third week in March. Council Member Blink also said that he has received a drainage request from a resident on Nancy Ct who keeps reaching out him, but he is not exactly sure what the issue is. President Lepine said he would check with Scott Rousselle tomorrow;
- In regard to the sheet pile wall in Empire, Todd Eppley said a RFQ package was sent out today. Quotes are due back by next Friday and the job will be given to the lowest bidder.

A. The Plaquemines Parish Council hereby divides and creates new precincts to be used in its redistricting plan to be first implemented for all purposes related to the regularly scheduled elections for the Plaquemines Parish Council, and otherwise, in the Fall of 2022.

B. Precinct 2-2 is hereby divided to create Precincts 2-2 and 2-2A. Precinct 2-2A is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of Woodland Hwy. and LA Hwy. 23, which is also the precinct boundary between Precincts 2-2 and 3-1, then proceed northwesterly along the southernmost lane of LA Hwy. 23 (and the precinct boundary) to the intersection with La Rosa Court Lane, then northeasterly along La Rosa Court Lane to the intersection with northernmost lane of LA Hwy. 23, then southeasterly along LA Hwy. 23 to the intersection with Vista Dr., then northeasterly along Vista Dr. to the intersection with a Railroad, then northwesterly along the Railroad to the intersection with Barrier Canal, then northeasterly along Barrier Canal to the intersection with an unnamed canal, then southeasterly along the canal to the intersection with Woodland Hwy., then southerly along Woodland Hwy. to the point of beginning. The remainder of the original Precinct 2-2 is redesignated as Precinct 2-2.

C. Precinct 3-1 is hereby divided to create Precincts 3-1, 3-1A and 3-1B. Precinct 3-1A is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of Demandre St. and the boundary between Precincts 3-1 and 4-1, then proceed northerly and then westerly along the precinct boundary to the intersection with Villary St., then southerly along Villary St. to the intersection with Ave. A, then easterly along Ave. A to the intersection with Hunt St., then southerly along Hunt Street to the intersection with Melvyn Dr., then easterly along Melvyn Dr. to the intersection with W 3rd St., then southerly along W 3rd St. to the intersection with Demandre St., then easterly along Demandre St. to the point of beginning. Precinct 3-1B is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of Saint Ann St. and the boundary between Precincts 4-1 and 3-1, then proceed

westerly along Saint Ann St. to the intersection with Oak Tree Rd., then southerly along Oak Tree Rd. to the intersection with Woodchase Drive, which is also the boundary between Precincts 4-1 and 3-1, then proceed easterly then northerly along the precinct boundary to the point of beginning. The remainder of the original Precinct 3-1 is redesignated as Precinct 3-1.

D. Precinct 4-1 is divided to create Precincts 4-1 and 4-1A. Precinct 4-1A is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of Main St. and the boundary between Precincts 4-1 and 3-1, then proceed northerly along Main St. to the intersection with Ave. G, then easterly along Ave. G to the intersection with the levee, then northerly along the levee to the intersection with Oak Rd., which is also the boundary between Precincts 4-1 and 2-1, then westerly and southerly along the precinct boundary, then southeasterly along the boundary between Precincts 4-1 and 3-1 to the point of beginning. The remainder of Precinct 4-1 is redesignated as Precinct 4-1.

E. Precinct 4-2 is divided to create Precincts 4-2, 4-2A and 4-2B. Precinct 4-2A is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of Oak Tree Dr. and Apricot St., then proceed easterly along Apricot St. to the intersection with the Eastern Lane of LA State Hwy. 23, then northerly along LA State Hwy., 23 to the intersection with Oliver Ave., then easterly along Oliver Ave. to the intersection with Oak Tree Rd., then southerly along Oak Tree Rd. to the point of beginning. Precinct 4-1B is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of Chambers Ave. and 5th Street, which is also the boundary between Precincts 4-1 and 5-1, then proceed northerly along the precinct boundary to the intersection with an unnamed canal, then proceed northwesterly, then northerly along the canal to the intersection with Magaome Rd., then easterly along Magaome Rd. to the intersection with the boundary between Precincts 5-1 and 4-2, then proceed southerly, as it coincides first with Olson Dr. then with Ave. F, then with McDonald Ave., then to Rinard Rd., then Chambers Ave. to the point of beginning. The remainder of Precinct 4-2 is redesignated as Precinct 4-2.

F. Precinct 5-1 is divided into Precincts 5-1 and 5-1A. Precinct 5-1A is described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of Walker Rd. and the westernmost lane of LA Hwy. 23, then proceed easterly along Walker Rd., which is also the boundary between Precincts 5-1 and 6-1, then easterly along the precinct boundary to the intersection with the Parish boundary to the intersection with the Intercoastal Waterway, then northeasterly along the Intercoastal Waterway to the intersection with the boundary between Precincts 5-1 and 5-2, then easterly along the boundary to the intersection with Bayou Barriere, then southerly along the Bayou to the intersection with Buccaneer Rd., then easterly, then southeasterly along Buccaneer Rd. to the intersection with westernmost lane of LA Hwy. 23, then southerly to the point of beginning. The remainder of Precinct 5-1 is redesignated as Precinct 5-1.

G. Precinct 5-2 is divided to create Precincts 5-2, 5-2A and 5-2B. Precinct 5-2A is described as that portion of the prior Precinct 5-2 lying south of the ship channel off of the intercoastal waterway, bounded on the east by the intercoastal waterway and on the west by Jefferson Parish. Precinct 5-2B is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of the Barrier Canal and Good News Ave., then proceed southeasterly along Good News Ave. to the intersection with I St., then proceed northly along I St. to the intersection with the southernmost lane of LA Hwy. 23, which is also the boundary between Precincts 5-2 and 2-2, then northwesterly along the boundary to the intersection with Barrier Canal, then southerly along the canal to the point of beginning. The remainder of Precinct 5-2 is redesignated as Precinct 5-2.

H. Precinct 6-1 is divided to create Precincts 6-1, 6-1A and 6-1B. Precinct 6-1A is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of Intrepid Dr. and Yorktown Lane, then proceed northeasterly along Yorktown Lane which is the boundary between Precincts 6-1 and 4-2, continuing along such boundary southeasterly, then southerly along Enterprise St., then continuing along the boundary as it becomes Rue Perez, then continuing along the boundary as it becomes Russell Dr., then continuing easterly along the boundary to the Mississippi River, then proceeding southerly along the boundary to the intersection of the Mississippi River and Sewer Plant Rd., then westerly along Sewer Plant Rd. to the intersection of the boundary between precincts 5-1 and 6-1, then northerly along the boundary, then westerly along the boundary, then southerly along the boundary, then easterly along the boundary, the northwesterly along the

boundary, the westerly along the boundary, then northwesterly along the boundary, the northerly along the boundary as it becomes Rinard Ave., then northerly along the boundary, then easterly along the boundary, then northerly along the boundary as it becomes Midway Dr., then becomes Intrepid Drive, then northwesterly along Intrepid Dr. to the point of beginning. Precinct 6-1B is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of E. Walker Road and the boundary between Precincts 5-1 and 6-1, then westerly along E. Walker Rd and the precinct boundary, then southerly along the boundary, then westerly along the boundary, to the intersection of the precinct boundary of Precinct 6-1 and the Parish boundary, then southerly along the boundary to the intersection with the boundary between Precincts 6-1 and 6-2, then southerly along the boundary, then easterly along the boundary, then northerly along the boundary, then easterly along the boundary as it becomes Sarah Canal to the intersection with LA Hwy. 23, then northerly along LA Hwy. 23 to the point of beginning. The remainder of Precinct 6-1 is redesignated as Precinct 6-1

I. Precinct 6-2 is divided to create Precincts 6-2, 6-2A and 6-2B. Precinct 6-2A is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of the boundary between Precincts 6-1 and 6-2 and Bayou Baratavia, then proceed southwestly along the Bayou to the intersection with the Parish boundary, then southerly along the Parish boundary to the intersection with the boundary between Precincts 6-2 and 8-1, then easterly along the boundary to the intersection with Ollie Canal, and continue northeasterly then northwesterly along Ollie Canal to the intersection with the boundary between Precincts 6-1 and 6-2, then westerly and then northerly along the boundary to the point of beginning. Precinct 6-2B is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of Adam Dr. and Jason Dr. then proceeding northly on Jason Dr. to the intersection with Maud Olive Dr., then easterly on Maud Olive Dr. to the intersection with the westernmost lane of LA Hwy. 23, then southerly along LA Hwy. 23 to the intersection with Adam Dr., then westerly along Adam Dr. to the point of beginning. The remainder of Precinct 6-2 is redesignated as Precinct 6-2.

J. Precinct 8-1 is divided to create Precincts 8-1 and 8-1A. Precinct 8-1A is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of Ranatza Rd. and the Railroad, then proceed easterly along Ranatza Rd., which is also the boundary between Precincts 8-1 and 6-2, then continue southerly along the precinct boundary to the intersection with the boundary between Precincts 8-1, 6-2 and 7-1, then easterly along the boundary between Precincts 8-1 and 7-1 to the intersection with the easternmost lane of LA Hwy. 23, then northerly along LA Hwy. 23 to the intersection with Brooks Lane, then easterly along Brooks Lane to the intersection with the Railroad, then northerly along the Railroad to the point of beginning. The remainder of Precinct 8-1 is redesignated as Precinct 8-1.

K. Precinct 8-2 is divided to create Precincts 8-2 and 8-2A. Precinct 8-2A is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of Paul Dr. and Levee Rd., then proceed southerly along Paula Dr., which is the boundary between Precincts 7-2 and 8-2, then continue easterly and southerly along the precinct boundary to the intersection with the an unnamed canal, then southeasterly along the canal to another unnamed canal, then northly along the canal to the intersection with the northernmost lane of LA Hwy. 23, then easterly along LA Hwy. 23 to the intersection with Edgecombe Lane, then northeasterly along Edgecombe Lane to the intersection with Hwy. 11, then northerly along Hwy. 11 to the intersection with Lincoln Dr., then northerly along Lincoln Dr. to the intersection with Levee Rd., then westerly along Levee Rd. to the point of beginning. The remainder of Precinct 8-2 is redesignated as Precinct 8-2.

L. The Precincts created hereby shall be utilized for all purposes related to the elections to be held in the Parish of Plaquemines in the Fall of 2022 and thereafter until changed .

SECTION 2

The redistricting plan entitled Plaquemines Plan 2022, as described below and more specifically depicted in the shape files and block equivalency files submitted to the Louisiana Secretary of State, be and is hereby adopted and such plan shall be utilized for the regularly scheduled elections in the Fall of 2022 for the Plaquemines Parish Council, in accordance with Louisiana law.

DISTRICT 1

District 1 consists of the entirety of precincts 1-1, 1-2, 1-3 and 6-1A.

DISTRICT 2

District 2 consists of the entirety of precincts 2-1, 2-2A and 4-1A.

DISTRICT 3

District 3 consists of the entirety of precincts 3-1A, 4-2A and 5-2B.

DISTRICT 4

District 4 consists of the entirety of precincts 3-1A, 3-1B, 4-1 and 4-2.

DISTRICT 5

District 5 consists of the entirety of precinct 2-2 and 5-2.

DISTRICT 6

District 6 consists of the entirety of precincts 4-2B, 5-1, 6-1 and 6-2.

DISTRICT 7

District 7 consists of the entirety of precincts 7-1, 7-2, 8-1A and 8-2A.

DISTRICT 8

District 8 consists of the entirety of precincts 5-1A, 5-2A, 6-1B, 6-2A, 6-2B, 8-1 and 8-2.

DISTRICT 9

District 9 consists of the entirety of precincts 8-3, 9-1 and 9-2.

SECTION 3

The Secretary of this Council is hereby authorized and directed to immediately certify and release this Ordinance and that Parish employees and officials are authorized to carry out the purposes of this Ordinance, both without further reading and approval by the Plaquemines Parish Council.

WHEREAS, a proposed Text Amendment was filed by the Plaquemines Parish Development Board (Application No. 2022-487, dated January 6, 2022) to consider a text amendment to the Comprehensive Ordinance No. 142, Section XII (Amendments and Petitions) by enacting Subsection 6 “Temporary Housing Need”; and

WHEREAS, after a public hearing was held on February 1, 2022, providing all interested parties and the public with an opportunity to be heard regarding the proposed Text Amendment, and the advertisement required by law was made in the Plaquemines Gazette, the official journal of the Parish of Plaquemines; and

WHEREAS, the Plaquemines Parish Development Board during the open public hearing made an amendment to the originally proposed Text Amendment; and

WHEREAS, at a meeting held on February 1, 2022, the Plaquemines Parish Development Board favorably adopted a resolution recommending the Text Amendment as proposed by the Plaquemines Parish Development Board (Application No. 2022-487, dated January 6, 2022) to consider a Text Amendment to the Comprehensive Ordinance No. 142, Section XII (Amendments and Petitions) by enacting Subsection 6 “Temporary Housing Need”;

NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PLAQUEMINES PARISH COUNCIL THAT:

SECTION 1

To amend Section XII of Ordinance No. 142, the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of Plaquemines Parish, by enacting Subsection 6 which shall read as follows:

“6. Whenever the Plaquemines Parish Council determines an immediate need for temporary housing exists, it may, by Ordinance so declare and establish rules, regulations and procedures for the issuance of temporary permits for the placement and operation of Recreational Vehicle Parks, Recreational Vehicle sites, Travel Trailers, Campgrounds, and other temporary housing units or facilities so authorized and temporarily suspend any map change (rezone petition) requirements related thereto. In no event shall any Ordinance adopted under the authority of this Subsection authorize the issuance or renewal of temporary permits for a period to exceed three (3) years.

Permits granted under this Subsection may only be issued in the following areas:

- A. Flood Plain Zoning District, but only on parcels where the Plaquemines Parish Council has issued a similar temporary permit in the last ten (10) years, and
- B. All non-Flood Plain Zoning Districts located downriver from the centerline of St. Jude Road in Port Sulphur, LA.

This Subsection shall not apply to Citrus City.”
