The Prayer and Pledge were dispensed with.

President Lepine was not in attendance; however, Directors Crystal Taylor, Scott Rousselle and Todd Eppley were present representing the Administration.

Council Member Cognevich advanced to Agenda Item 11d, “District 1 update”. Without objection, so ordered.

- Item 7, “East Bank residents’ discussion regarding the Eastbank Recreation Program”: Several residents addressed the Council regarding the need for the Davant Swimming Pool to be opened this summer, for the pool to be cleaned and for Lifeguards to be hired. Also, the CEA still needs to be signed by the Volunteer Fire Department.

Council Member Black left the meeting at 5:20 p.m.

- Item 8, “Update on the Davant Center Air Conditioner”: Director Todd Eppley stated the second new air conditioner was ordered 3-4 weeks ago and it is expected to be finished by mid-July.
- Item 6, “Discussion of sediment from Mardi Gras Pass making bayous and canals impassable for fishermen and impacting their income: Mr. Glenden Miller, a local fisherman, addressed the Council stating that Mardi Gras Pass is killing their way of life. He had to make several repairs to his boat due to running aground in bodies of water that are being affected by Mardi Gras Pass. He further stated that the passages need to be cleared. Danny Demolle then address the Council stating he has been in the oyster industry for last 40 years and for the last 10 years he has been watching what is happening with Mardi Gras Pass. He said the Parish needs to open its eyes because in the next several years oysters will be like caviar; too expensive and no one will be able to afford them. Unless this issue is addressed, oysters, shrimp, crabs and fish will be gone in 10 years. Council Member Blink asked what was the Parish’s intent? Land growth or seafood production? Council Member Rousselle said the Coastal Zone Director would have to address these issues and asked if Mr. Helmers was at work today and he was told by Director Todd Eppley he was at work earlier today.
- Item 4, “Updates on all East Bank pump stations and discussion of the Administration’s contingency plan for the upcoming Hurricane Season”. Director Scott Rousselle provided an in-depth update on these issues stating that we are at 50% of the pumps from Phoenix to Bohemia. Council Member Barthelemy said the one at Bellevue looks like it is smoking pretty good and that is an indication of it going out soon. Council Member Rousselle asked if Belle Chasse I is at 75% capacity and Director Rousselle said yes it was and they are waiting on valve to make the repair. He also said that Belle Chase II is at 33% and they are waiting on parts to repair it also. Director Scott Rousselle said that

the Medal of Honor Park is still at 33% and they will get with the Engineering firm to get a price to fix the pump. Council Member Rousselle said been hearing that for years.

Council Member Cognevich advanced to Agenda Item 11a(1).

Council Member Cognevich offered a Motion to Suspend the Rules to add an item for consideration at today's meeting. It was seconded by Council Member Guey and on roll call, all members present voting "YES", except Council Member Black who was "ABSENT", the motion was adopted by a vote of 8-0.

#### RESOLUTION NO. 22-114

On motion of Council Member Cognevich and with a unanimous second, and on roll call all members present and voting "YES", except Council Member Black who was "ABSENT", the following resolution was adopted:

A Resolution expressing Plaquemines Parish's opposition to HB1033 which provides for restrictions and requirements applicable to commercial menhaden catch; to provide for the duties and responsibilities of the Department of Wildlife; and otherwise to provide with respect thereto.

WHEREAS, HB1033 proposes that all commercial menhaden companies utilizing vessels equipped with purse seines operating in Louisiana territorial waters for the purpose of reduction fishing shall land no more than two hundred sixty thousand metric tons, or five hundred seventy-three million pounds, of menhaden from within those waters on an annual basis. Of the two hundred sixty thousand metric tons, or five hundred seventy-three million pounds harvested within state waters, the following shall apply:

(1) A maximum of fifty-two thousand metric tons or one hundred fifteen million pounds can be caught, or no more than two thousand six hundred fifty individual sets shall be made within one mile off the shore within a calendar year.

(2) A maximum of one hundred four thousand metric tons or two hundred twenty-nine million pounds can be caught, or no more than five thousand two hundred fifty individual sets shall be made between one and two miles off the shore within a calendar year.

B. For purposes of this Section, "individual set" means when a purse seine is deployed and encircles a school of menhaden, regardless of whether those fish are reduced to possession by transferring to the mother ship or steamer.

C. For purposes of this Section, the distance from shore shall be calculated using the inside-outside line as described in R.S. 56:495 and shall include the area of Breton and Chandeleur Sound within the calculations of sets and tonnage, with the definition of the area as an estimated line denoting approximate average marsh edge on the northern and western boundary of Breton and Chandeleur Sound, and using the shrimp inside-outside line defining the southern and eastern boundary of Breton and Chandeleur Sound, stopping at the state line between Louisiana and Mississippi, excluding any portion of Lake Borgne.

D. All commercial menhaden companies utilizing vessels equipped with purse seines for the purpose of reduction fishing shall be required to report daily set locations via GPS, reading in degrees, minutes, and seconds, with a defined datum; length at catch in centimeters based on the length of a subset of fifty individuals; estimated tonnage per set; and end product disposition, bait or reduction, to the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries no later than 12:00 pm, central standard time (CST) each day. The Department of Wildlife and Fisheries shall be required to compile, evaluate, and make said totals publicly available by 12:00 pm CST daily. The Department of Wildlife and Fisheries shall also have the authority to close zones 0-1 and 1-2 when total sets or tons are expected to meet the established set or catch limits in each zone respectively, and shall have the authority to re-open one or all zones should the set or catch limit not be met or keep zones closed should the catch or set limit be met.

E. Any set occurring once a zone is closed by the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries in a

given year shall result in reduced harvest in total annual sets and tons in subsequent years. In addition, specific fines and penalties may be assessed 2 to captains or companies for annual set or tonnage violations. 3 F. Nothing in this Section shall restrict the Department of Wildlife and 4 Fisheries from promulgating additional rules and regulations regarding area fishing 5 restrictions in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act. 6 G. Anyone legally taking menhaden shall not have in their possession more 7 than five percent, by weight, of any species of fish other than menhaden and herring-like species.

WHEREAS, if HB1033 is enacted it will negatively affect Plaquemines Parish's largest employer in the southern part of the Parish and our fisherman;

2. *Conditional uses:*

- (a) Parks, playgrounds, libraries and museums.
- (b) Churches.
- (c) Public and private schools
- (d) Commercial aquarium, beach, circus or carnival grounds, zoo, amusement park or midway, when located on a site of at least fifty thousand (50,000) square feet and set back, a minimum of fifty (50) feet from any property line abutting a residential district.
- (e) Cemeteries and mausoleums on site of not less than five (5) acres.
- (f) Funeral homes and mortuaries located on a site not less than twenty-five thousand (25,000) square feet and set back twenty (20) feet from all property lines. When such facilities abut a residential district, a visual screen of a fence or wall minimum of seven (7) feet high shall be provided along all interior lot lines except within the front yard requirements.
- (g) Industrial and trade schools.
- (h) Temporary residential trailer to be occupied by the owner of the property under the following circumstances:
  - (i) To facilitate the renovation or reconstruction of the primary residence on the property;
  - (ii) The need for the renovation or reconstruction is attributable to a severe weather event, such as a hurricane, flood or tornado;
  - (iii) To be removed within seven (7) days of the completion of the renovation or reconstruction of the primary residence on the property or for a period not to exceed six (6) months which period may be extended an additional six (6) months upon approval of the Council.

WHEREAS, said toll has left Plaquemines Parish residents, Plaquemines Parish businesses and along with any out of Parish employees, with an undue burden of bearing partial costs of this P3; and

WHEREAS, as collaborations between the state and the private sector are likely in the future, it would benefit the public to have the legislative auditor review the process that resulted in the execution of the agreement with Plenary Infrastructure Belle Chasse LLC, to inform the legislature and executive branch to develop best practices that protect the public, while ensuring quality construction projects that serve the people of Louisiana; and

There being no further business to come before this Council, on motion Council Member Newberry, seconded by Council Member LaFrance, and on roll call all members present voting "YES" except Council Members Black and Arbourgh who were "ABSENT", the meeting adjourned at 6:50 p.m.
